At our nursery school, we conducted a series of engaging activities to support early childhood development in a fun and creative way. Children enjoyed a Hindi Bud Painting Activity - where they used ear buds and paint to trace and fill Hindi letters and a clay dough activity - to make English alphabets. This helped them to recognize alphabets while developing fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination.

In the Coordination Activity, various playful exercises were introduced to improve balance, focus, and body coordination. These activities encouraged movement and built physical confidence in a joyful environment.
